LAHORE, PAKISTAN | JUNE 8-22, 2019

Security studies, religious studies, urban studies, cultural studies, and history all have various interests in and viewpoints on **Pakistan**.

This seminar, organized by **CAORC** and its member center in Pakistan, the **American Institute of Pakistan Studies**, seeks to add nuance and context to these understandings by providing participants with firsthand experiences of various cultural sites and practices in **Lahore**, including its medieval walled city and its colonial architectural landmarks, as well as facilitating meetings with local scholars, artists, and others.

Through encountering Lahore's urban geography, participants will glimpse how religious diversity, political struggle, and cultural expression fold into each other in this ancient city of over ten million people.

The program is only open to faculty members at community colleges or minority-serving institutions. Awarded faculty will receive round-trip travel, accommodations, and meals for the seminar.
